Your entry will explain your understanding of the project title, your views, feelings and any research on volunteerism. Also, if you think volunteerism needs to be recognised and promoted more in our country, tell us why, and how you would approach the task, to include the younger generation.

ENTRY REQUIRMENTS

The contest is an outreach by the Governor General's Volunteer Bahamas.

Children ages 10-16 may enter. Judging will be in two age categories: 10 - 13 years and 14 - 16 years and a winner selected from each of the two age groups. Submissions are set at one entry per child. The Judge's decision is final. The winners agree to submit to a photo presentation to be distributed to the print and digital media. The submitted entry content may be used by the Governor General's Committee for publicity and promotional purposes.

Your essay should be between 300 and 600 words. All entries must be received at the Governor General's office at 1, Montague Foreshore, Nassau, no later than January 15th, 2023. Or by email in an attached PDF to ggvolunteers@bahamas.gov.bs
